The North Western Agricultural Society Committee welcomed Jessica Stenson, recent Commonwealth Games gold medallist as the special guest to officially open the Show. Jess spoke of her experience winning the gold medal, whilst having it on display for all to see. She received some great questions from students at the Crystal Brook School in a Q&A session.

New Life Members were acknowledged for their years of dedicated service - Stuart Everett for his many years of hard work and dedication to the Sheep section; and a posthumous Life Membership presented to Vivienne Combe in recognition of her husband Graham Combe, for his vision to commence the Combined Sporting Bodies catering many years ago, which now serves as a major fundraiser for multiple sporting groups in Crystal Brook. The Catering Shed at the Showgrounds now has a sign in Graham's honour. The time given by the many volunteers is valuable and provides a considerable contribution to the success of the Show.

Whilst some heavy rain on Friday evening threatened to dampen the event, the weather mostly held out on the day, with more than 3500 people enjoying a Show that had been three years in the making.

Patrons of all ages enjoyed the return of showbags and sideshow alley, together with various entertainment, stalls and exhibits. The Fashion Parade, showcasing regional designers was a hit with the crowd, as was the number of kids who built Lego with Trent and Josh, contestants from the Lego Masters TV Show. The transition of exhibits to the Rec Centre was one of many highlights of the day, providing a bright new location for many wonderful entries to be on display.

The North Western Agricultural Society Committee would like to thank all the Sponsors, Donors, Convenors, Judges, Patrons, combined sporting clubs, Members and the wider community for supporting the Show. Without this valuable support and assistance, it wouldn't have been the success that it was. Planning has begun for 2023.


We look forward to seeing you at 7.30 pm on October 10 in the Institute meeting room.



# CRYSTAL BROOK COMMUNITY GARDEN



Behind the Crystal Brook Men's Shed, unnoticed by most residents apart from those who use the town walking track you will find the Crystal Brook Community Garden, which is being established by a small number of volunteers. There are at least 15 raised beds available for planting, with four or five of those now being prepared with good soil in time for the spring growing season. There are full tanks of water and some potting tables which will be refurbished.

What is most needed are more willing hands to help the work progress more swiftly. Members of the community are invited to come along on Tuesday and Thursday mornings to the Men's Shed between 9 and 12 for a personalised tour of the Garden.

A joining fee of \$50.00 is payable to the Men's Shed to cover costs such as insurance and the application of relevant local government requirements.

The Garden is not intended to produce ornamental plants, but will concentrate on vegetable and fruit growing from certified seed and seedlings which will be provided in exchange for a gold coin donation. Participants may keep choose to keep their produce or donate it to Mid-North Food for All, but it cannot be sold. In addition to the benefits of freshly grown and harvested fruit and vegetables, participants in the Community Garden will have the advantage of an outdoor activity whilst making connections with the other like-minded volunteers.

# CRYSTAL BROOK PRIMARY SCHOOL

The School has been successful with our application for a 2022 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant to redevelop the Ngalkutya Garden. (Ngalkutya means "to eat").

The garden will be used by students to grow their own food to use in lessons. A part of the grant will also be used to upgrade the school's garden equipment and help provide a space that helps the environment.

Each class also has mini compost bin which they will use to collect food scraps, limiting the school's waste.

Crystal Brook Primary School is one of 1,054 primary schools and early learning centres throughout Australia receiving a Woolworths Junior Landcare grant to help grow our next generation of environmental champions.

We were very fortunate to have a new local business, The Long Room Hardware, providing new equipment and many thanks go to Jodie and the team at the store. Sam Smith was a massive help in coordinating the grant application process as was Megan Smart and we thank them.

The children and teachers are looking forward to working with and learning from this project and we'll keep you updated on the results.



#### MID NORTH FOOD FOR ALL

Wondering what you are going to do with all those oranges just falling on the ground?

Do you know of someone who is finding it hard to put food on the table in these increasingly tough times? Would you spend a couple of hours a fortnight packing food boxes?

Food For All is here to help you.

We are an informal group of community-minded people supported by Foodbank Australia who provide fresh fruit and vegetables, bread and nonperishable food items.

The Port Pirie Regional Council provides the Crystal Brook Institute Hall at no cost, and the Red Cross covers our insurance obligations.

Over the last 18 months we have had a 100% increase in the number of families we assist. Our wonderful group of volunteers currently pack around 50 free food boxes, serving the Crystal Brook, Gladstone, Redhill, and Koolunga communities. They do a great job and deserve a big thank you!

In order to keep costs down and provide this valuable service to many families, the abattoir is looking for stock that is not suitable for commercial sale and would otherwise be destroyed to assess its suitability for this initiative. Our fundraising efforts have been in full swing - we have been able to purchase a new blood pressure machine for Rosier Cottage, which is a valuable asset to have in the Cottage. We launched our new HR platform – CompliSpace – and we are very excited about it! This will help the Admin and Management team immensely will all things HR related, and the clinical team can also utilise this to input any Resident incidents. We have had 3 months of video conferences with Gavin Ng from CompliSpace to teach us how to use the program.

We also passed our accreditation. Thank you to all of our amazing staff and residents who played their part in making this happen.

#### A SPOT ON THE MAP

Places of interest, history, beauty,



The photo is of the tunnel through part of the Yackamoorundie Ranges from which the backup water supply from the Bundaleer Reservoir is carried to small towns in the Mid-North and Port Wakefield. Using pumps, the water is stored in many large concrete tanks set high on nearby hills to maintain pressure to the surrounding towns. It was constructed around 1898-1903. A newer pipe-line from Morgan was constructed in 1944-45.

From Crystal Brook, travel east along Goyder Highway. At Horrocks Highway, turn right towards Clare. Near the 8km marker before Yacka, turn left at Hermitage Road, (gravel)to the tunnel viewing spot. If required use your map or GPS.


We are very excited to announce some good news, our application with Home Hardware has been successful and we will be supported by this Independent Hardware Group from 4<sup>th</sup> October.



#### Crystal Brook CFS News

On February 9 this year, Spencer Group which is based in Crystal Brook, took delivery of its new BW10CAFS. This is a Bulk Water Carrier, capable of carrying 10,000 litres of water. It also carries a large amount of Class A foam, which can be mixed with the water to form copious amounts of firefighting foam through a Compressed Air Foam System (CAFS). The compressed air system allows it to produce both wet and dry foam and anything in between. This will make it extremely useful right across our Region not just within Spencer Group and Crystal Brook. It will be able to be used for creating fire breaks with foam, helping to suppress structure and vehicle fires and can be used for various other firefighting roles. It has a 12 speed gearbox with retarder that makes it more manageable to drive and pull up. A number of members throughout the Spencer group were present for its delivery and some undertaking driver training in the new appliance. On March 6 a training day was held near Rocky River Ag at Crystal Brook allowing members to learn how to operate the pump and compressor in order to produce Compressed Air Foam. This replaces our older BW13 which has now been sent for refurbishing before being delivered to another group.

Working with SAAS (SA Ambulance Service)

Quite often, Crystal Brook CFS is called to assist SAAS with patient lifting or movement. On June 28 Crystal Brook SAAS (and MNERTs) and CFS conducted a training exercise at Bowman Park simulating a casualty in the creek area with a broken leg. SAAS crews responded to the casualty with CFS responding to assist with lifting and relocating the casualty safely to a stretcher and waiting ambulance. There were some challenges for all with slippery conditions and the extra unknown scenario

of an extra injury thrown in to test the response of SAAS members. It's great to be able to work together to see how each organisation operates and see the equipment that we both have available for things like this. Two volunteer organisations helping keep the local community safe.

#### TIME HOP 1940's

from the Crystal Brook Courier, May 1940

The Australian Wheat Board for the protection of the wheat that had been sold to the British Government and other purchasers had selected two country centres for wheat storage depots in South Australia, one at Kadina and the other at Crystal Brook, from where the wheat would be railed to Wallaroo and Port Pirie respectively.

The Crystal Brook site was on railway property and adjacent sites occupying about 15 acres with a stacking capacity of between one and a half and two million bags. Daily wheat was transferred to Crystal Brook from railway yards and sidings on the narrow-gauge systems — Wilmington— Port Pirie, Peterborough— Pirie; broad gauge Yacka — Gladstone. Mammoth stacks were built and roofed, with the sides being protected with hessian. The installation of the stacking sites, sheds, the receiving and handling of wheat provided employment for between 50 and 60 men. the wages bill amounting to about £250 a week.

The attached photo clearly shows those sheds in the railway yards and to the northwest.


encouraged those present to continue on in their current ministries.


#### What is Paper Talk?
