You must have your own insurance. Santa will arrive in Sullivan Place at about 7.30pm, depending on his reindeer and Citizen of the Year and other announcements.





LOCAL DOCTOR WINS GP AWARD

"I'm extremely blessed and honoured to have been awarded the SA/NT Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) GP of the Year award. I'm not sure who nominated me - this year there were patient nominations as well as colleagues so I'm not likely to find out the source but I am extremely grateful. The nominations go to a faculty panel who then decide on the award winners. I grew up on Kangaroo Island and then studied medicine at Adelaide University. I enjoyed a lot of rural medicine experience as a medical student.

It was always a plan to work in rural medicine and I was lucky enough to secure a registrar (GP training) position at Jamestown and Peterborough and then moved to Crystal Brook to complete that training. After my GP training I then completed my GP Obstetrics training part-time at Port Augusta.

I have now been working at Crystal Brook Medical Practice for 10 years. We also look after Laura Hospital and Laura District Medical Practice where I also have the pleasure of working. I provide rural general practice care to patients, emergency care in the hospital for presentations when on-call, and GP Obstetrics at Crystal Brook Hospital. I also have an interest in aged and palliative care.

There have been lots of challenges in rural health care provision in recent years - the pandemic has obviously had a huge impact, and the workforce shortages across health that include rural doctors but also nursing staff and allied health professionals can make for trying times. But receiving an award like this is a wonderful thing for the region and for rural South Australian health. I have the privilege of being involved in people's care, and I love the continuity of care I get to be a part of by working in our General Practices and our local hospitals.

I couldn't do any of this without such wonderful support from my colleagues - the team of doctors, nurses, and administration staff, and most importantly without the support of my beautiful family. Thanks so much."

A Spot on the Map



THE GREAT STONE WALL

The Great Dry Stone Wall runs along the high ridges of Camel's Hump and Brown Hill Ranges. South Australia's longest stone wall, is 65 km in length and has an estimated 7 million stones used in its construction around the 1860's by the then leaseholders, farming families and tradesmen. During the 1850's most of the shepherds had left for the gold fields so there was a need for fences. One of the better viewing spots is off Olives Road where the wall crosses. Park here then walk to the left, climbing the rise following the wall until you pass one of the many stone quarries from where stones were obtained.

Access is permitted along this section as it is part of The Heysen Trail. Here you can walk alongside and close up. Off in the distance a thin black line runs over barren hilltops down gullies and up slopes where it then vanishes out of sight. Here you can also get a wonderful view over the plains below. Great for photography.

From Crystal Brook follow the Goyder Highway, (B64) and turn right at "T" junction, now R. M. Williams Way, to Spalding. Continue on B64 in Spalding, then turn right then left towards Burra. Cross Fresh Water and Deep Creek, further on turn left at pumping station onto Deep Creek Road (unsealed), right at Marble Hill Road then a short distance left into Olives Road and continue on to the wall. Carry your map or GPS.

MID-NORTH FOOD FOR ALL







Supporting Crystal Brook and surrounding towns, we are an informal group of community-minded people supported by Foodbank Australia, who provide fresh fruit and vegetables, bread and non-perishable food items. The Port Pirie Regional Council provide the Crystal Brook Institute Hall at no cost, and the Red Cross covers our insurance obligations.

Our community would like to thank these organisations for their generous sponsorship.

Over the last 18 months we have had a 100% increase in the number of families we assist. Our wonderful group of volunteers currently pack around 50 free food boxes, serving the Crystal Brook, Gladstone, Redhill, and Koolunga communities.

Over 2 million households in Australia have experienced severe food insecurity in the last 12 months – Foodbank Hunger Report, 2022.

Sadly, our capacity to assist new clients has reached its limit. If you have easy access to other food services such as the Food Hub in Port Pirie, it would be great if you could sign up with them, freeing up our food boxes for people who cannot access other services. If your circumstances have changed for the better and you no longer need our services, please let us know so that your place can be taken by someone else in need. It is great that some of our food box recipients have now found employment and no longer need our assistance.

Our team of volunteers do a great job and deserve a big thank you! Particular thanks go to Maureen Jones and Greg Wakefield who deliver and distribute food boxes from Crystal Brook to Gladstone and Redhill, to Sue Gowan for fund-raising, Ros Weir for frozen meals, Helen Kirchner for fresh eggs, and Richard Eastwood for donating our new sack truck. Many hands make light work, so we can always welcome new volunteers.





WILSON FAMILY 150th REUNION



This year is 150 years since Peter Wilson, his wife Sarah and their family settled 'Byarlea" between Clements Gap and Merriton. They had migrated from Northumberland twenty years earlier and worked on and leased land at Pewsey Vale near Lyndoch. When land was being opened up for farming in the 1870s, Peter and his eldest son George inspected land throughout the Mid North, eventually purchasing land in the Clements Gap region, Hundred of Redhill in October 1872. To celebrate this occasion Peter Wilson, great-great grandson of the original Peter Wilson wrote and updated the family history book.

This book was launched at the Family Reunion held at Byarlea, the home of Matt and Tamara Wilson, George, Charlie and Lucy on the 2nd October. Over 110 relatives attended traveling from all States of Australia. There was a luncheon, book launch, tour of the property and the Clements Gap Church. The foundation stone was laid there by Mary Wilson, wife of George, to recognise four of their sons who served in World War One. Over the past 150 years the ownership of land has changed numerous times but there has been continuous farming by members of the Wilson family at Clements Gap and Merriton for the past 150 years. A great day was had by all that attended.



VEGETATION GROUP REPORT

This is a very small group of people, rounded up periodically, to do a bit of tidying and maintenance on vegetation areas around the town.

During the last twelve months all the planter boxes in Bowman Street have been dug over and fertiliser added. It was planned to have red and white geraniums planted in them, but before this was done bougainvillea had been purchased for each box. These hardy plants will add colour to the street.

The geranium cuttings that had been collected were propagated and will be planted in the perfumed garden bed on Railway Terrace.

The stone wall in this area has been repaired and fertiliser will be dug in before plants are added. The overgrown pelargonium has been trimmed back and cuttings removed by Council. Shrubs by the Post Office were trimmed so drivers had a clear view when leaving the car park.

Lantana on the corner by the Crystal Brook Hotel was trimmed back off the road. Vines by the newsagency and the Crystal Brook Hotel were trimmed and tidied and encouraged to grow along a wire under the edge of the verandah. Young trees in Mercowie Park and along Railway Terrace were mulched and watered numerous times during the hot weather. Young trees along the Walking Trail were mulched and watered several times.



Bingo at the Brook is still going strong and we have donated \$200 to the Bowman Park committee to help towards the restoration of Crystal Brook's missing goanna statues. 
Environmental Water Flow in the Brook



On Friday October 28, Landscape SA announced that through SA Water they would be releasing water from Beetaloo Reservoir on Saturday 29. This season two run-offs have occurred where the creek has flowed. The first flow reached the end of the Motor Club property on September 13 and the second flow just passed under the railway bridge in town on October 27.

It is hoped that with an already wet watercourse that this latest flow will penetrate further than the flow last year when it failed to pass under the bridge on Highway One on November 18, 2021. These latest flows will benefit aquatic life at Bowman Park and eventually benefit the River Red Gum trees further down the creek. Ultimately, with community pressure, it is hoped that "environmental flows" will be a regular occurrence for the Crystal Brook watercourse as it is for other creeks and rivers in South Australia.
